## How Are We Doing?

– *Reviewing 2004* –

**T**HE ALUMNI Association finished the year with a total of 42 Life Memberships – bringing our grand total to 576 Life Memberships which in part helps to endow the scholarship fund, and awarded seven scholarships, totaling \$7,000, to graduating seniors; published three *Tiger Tales* newsletters (42 issues since January 1991); maintained the Alumni Association website; sponsored an all-class reunion party at Town Hall during the Blossom weekend with over 500 alumni attending; with the Chagrin Falls Booster Club, provided a Blossom parade float for scholarship recipients to ride upon; hosted, for the second time, a family-friendly party tent during the parade; continued to sell alumni postcards at Town Hall in conjunction with Main Street's Visitor Center; during the high school commencement, presented a flower to each parent who graduated from Chagrin Falls High School and had a son or daughter graduating in the class of 2004; organized a very successful eighth annual Chagrin Falls Alumni Association golf outing; helped organize and support many class reunions and provided a reunion handbook for reunion committees; conducted the seventh Chagrin Falls Schools' Achievement Hall of Fame banquet; sponsored a reception/open house in the high school library and Chagrin Falls Schools' Historical Preservation Room after the homecoming football game; acquired and displayed more school memorabilia; organized a very successful seventh annual Chagrin Falls Alumni Association men's and women's varsity basketball alumni games; and continued to conduct a fundraiser for the upkeep of the Chagrin Falls Schools' Historical Preservation Room and scholarship fund with the sale of **JoAnne deHamel's '69** watercolor prints titled, Chagrin Falls...Standing Still in Time and conducted a fundraising tribute to honor **Tom Mattern '55**.

I hope that we have earned your support in 2005. Remember, all of this is for just a \$10 yearly membership – the same as it was in 1991!

On another happy note: Welcome to the 2005 Blossom Time Festival in Chagrin Falls with many thanks to the Chagrin Valley Jaycees for all of their hard work through the years to make it one of Chagrin's finest events. Many Chagrin Falls alumni are members and past members of this wonderful service organization in the Chagrin Valley. Blossom Time is the premier homecoming occasion of the year, along with the rapidly growing Hall of Fame/ Homecoming weekend in the fall. You're likely to see many old friends and familiar faces. 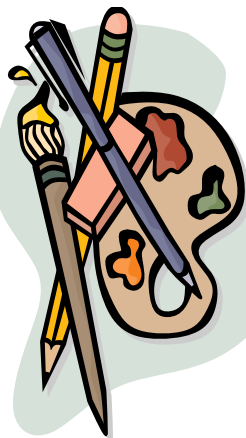

## Zenith High Points:

### Excerpts Of A Few Interesting Years At CFHS

**1973 ...** "The 18-year-old vote marked an awakening interest in politics for many CFHS students. For the first time in history we had seniors voting in the presidential election, and

most were anxious to be well informed. Through Ms. Kayser's Government class students were able to hear Sen. McGovern speak at Cleveland State, and band members and other students went to Aurora to greet President Nixon's motorcade. Also sponsored by the Government classes was a presidential debate with Councilman Jon Salerno representing Nixon and local Democrat Doug Smith debating for Mr. McGovern."

**1979 ...** "As the pumpkin roll grew near, the Seniors anxiously awaited that spectacular night. The night came, but unfortunately not many of the senior girls were invited to this event. Unlike

other years, the pumpkins were not rolled down Grove Hill. The police caught up to the culprits and would not allow them to drop the pumpkins. Disagreeing with the police, the fellows stubbornly rolled the pumpkins down any hill that they could find in Chagrin. At a later date, a few pumpkins were rolled down Grove Hill; this resulted in a mess for the city and a few arrests for the students."

**1980 ...** "Evolving from the rowdy Seniors of '79, an organized group of high-strung, loud, often obnoxious, but always spirited Tiger fans rocked the gym. The Zoo keeper honors were passed on to the antics of Dave Revelle. Loyal Zoo members were sighted at most winter athletic events declaring their pride with their trademark t-shirts. The Zoo blasted the Kenston Bleacher Creatures and out-winded the West Geauga Wolfpack. And so a relatively new and novel organization has set a standard for supporting the CFHS sport-stars."

## A Worthy Climb

**PETER FORD '74** is trying to climb Mt. Everest as a fund raising effort for The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (TLLS). As a child he fantasized about climbing Everest, but until 1999, when he first climbed Mt. Rainier as part of a guided group, he had never done any real mountaineering. About that time, a young cousin of his, Mia Rose, was diagnosed with leukemia. Peter donated blood granulocytes, which dramatically improved Mia's condition, but she suffered a relapse and died in 2000 at age 13. In her memory, he decided to climb four mountains to raise funds for TLLS. So far, Peter has climbed the first three and raised \$75,000: Mt. McKinley (2001), the highest peak in North America; Aconcagua (2002), the highest peak in South America & the Western Hemisphere; and Cho Oyu (2003), which is in the Himalayas and is the sixth highest peak in the world. **FROM THE 1915-1916**

**School Handbook:** The tuition for grades 9-12 was \$3/month and \$2.50/month for grades 1-8 during that school year. Although most textbooks were under \$1.00, the 10<sup>th</sup> grade history book was by far the most expensive fee for a student at \$1.42 for that year. The school year consisted of 36 weeks with the first semester beginning on the second Monday of September. The hours were from 9:00 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. with lunch from 12:00 to 1:45.

Although Chagrin Falls has been considered a very safe place, our history does include one murder. Aaron R. “A.R.” Chance was shot during a robbery of the First National Bank of Chagrin Falls on June 19, 1920. The 78-year-old lived in an apartment above the bank and came downstairs during the hold-up. Although the bank teller missed being shot, Mr. Chance was not as lucky. The trio of gunmen made off with \$2,500 in cash and a Liberty Bond. Mr. Chance is buried in Evergreen Cemetery. His story was a recent senior research project for Kenston graduate Scott Stoner and he was aided in the venture by Pat Zalba and the Chagrin Falls Historical Society.

This is an excerpt by **Ann Huggett Gumprecht '42** from Echoes of the Past – Vol. III: “It was customary for the senior class to have a Kid Day at the end of the school year. It was fun and silly because everyone dressed as little kids. Since our country was at war, the superintendent and principal, Mr. Sands and Mr. Gurney, decided that our class should forgo Kid Day. Naturally we were upset and disappointed, but we got together and planned a different day. This may have been the biggest event of our year. On Kid Day every member of our class played hooky and we enjoyed a day together playing ball and visiting. Due to the war, we knew many of the boys would be drafted as soon as they graduated. Now we cherish our pictures of that day at the Shelter House.”
